IIIT Sri City has been a part of the Innovation Cell of the Ministry of Education and has formed the Institute's Innovation Council (IIC). TBI will have an advisory committee consisting of prominent industrialists, entrepreneurs and technical experts to enable incubatees to benefit from expert consultants and networks in academic and industry sectors, he averred.


